1. Scope

2. Information We May Collect

Information you provide may include your name, business email, telephone number, employer or organization, title, correspondence, meeting requests, capability or vendor information, proposal-related business information, and other content you choose to send.

Website and network data may include IP address, approximate network-derived location, browser or device information, timestamps, request headers, referral pages, security signals, and cookie identifiers.

If you submit materials in connection with a business opportunity, we may receive business contact information, qualifications, resumes, capability descriptions, certifications, representations, pricing information, or other records reasonably related to the inquiry.

3. Sources of Personal Information

We may collect information directly from you, automatically from your browser or device, from service providers that operate infrastructure on our behalf, from government or commercial procurement platforms, from public sources where lawful, or from business partners that are authorized to share the information.

4. How We Use Personal Information

We may use personal information to operate and secure the website; respond to inquiries; evaluate teaming, subcontracting, vendor, recruiting, and customer relationships; prepare or administer proposals and business communications; maintain records; detect abuse or security incidents; comply with law and contractual obligations; and protect Wardright, customers, partners, and other stakeholders.

5. Website Infrastructure, Security, and Cloudflare

1. What Cookies Are

Cookies are small text files or data elements stored or accessed by a browser or device. Similar technologies can include local storage, tags, scripts, or other browser-based mechanisms that support website functions, security, preferences, or measurement.

2. Why Wardright May Use Cookies

Wardright may use cookies and similar technologies to operate and secure the website, distinguish legitimate traffic from bots or malicious traffic, support traffic routing and security challenges, remember choices where implemented, understand website performance, and comply with legal or consent requirements. We aim to avoid unnecessary tracking.

3. Strictly Necessary Technologies

Strictly necessary cookies or similar technologies may be required for security, network management, anti-abuse protection, traffic routing, or functions you expressly request. These technologies may operate without an optional cookie preference tool where permitted by law.

4. Analytics and Performance Technologies

Wardright may use limited, privacy-focused analytics to understand aggregate traffic, referral sources, page performance, device categories, and general website reliability. 5. Preference and Functional Technologies

6. Advertising and Cross-Context Tracking

7. Cloudflare and Security Cookies

Cloudflare provides infrastructure that can help protect and deliver the website. Depending on enabled services and security conditions, Cloudflare may set cookies or process request information associated with bot detection, security challenges, traffic filtering, or load balancing.

8. Cookie Duration

Cookies may be session cookies or persistent cookies. Duration depends on purpose and provider. Security cookies may have short lifetimes and may be refreshed when risk signals or challenge conditions change. The preference record used by Your Privacy Choices may be retained for up to 180 days unless you change your choices, clear browser storage, or your browser removes it sooner.

9. Managing Cookies

1. Scope and Responsibility

This AUP applies whenever you access or use a Wardright public digital resource or use a Wardright resource as part of a workflow involving third-party systems. You are responsible for your conduct, content, credentials, configurations, automation, and use of outputs.

2. Unlawful or Rights-Violating Use

You may not use Wardright resources to commit, facilitate, promote, instruct, or conceal unlawful activity; infringe or misappropriate copyright, trademark, trade secret, privacy, publicity, contractual, or other rights; unlawfully obtain or disclose personal or confidential information; or evade lawful restrictions, sanctions, court orders, or regulatory obligations.

3. Security Abuse and Unauthorized Access

You may not probe, scan, exploit, or test vulnerabilities of Wardright systems, Cloudflare configurations, networks, accounts, or infrastructure without explicit written authorization. You may not bypass authentication, defeat rate limits or access controls, intercept traffic without authorization, introduce backdoors, or interfere with security logging.

4. Malware and Harmful Code

You may not use Wardright resources to create, deliver, host, distribute, or facilitate malware, ransomware, destructive payloads, credential stealers, botnets, malicious scripts, exploit kits, or code intended to damage, disrupt, surveil, or gain unauthorized control of systems.

8. Harassment, Threats, and Exploitation

You may not use Wardright resources to facilitate credible threats, stalking, targeted harassment, doxxing, extortion, trafficking, exploitation, or unlawful abuse.

9. Dangerous and Highly Regulated Misuse

12. Credential and Access-Key Abuse

You may not use credentials, API keys, access tokens, accounts, certificates, licenses, or payment methods without authorization. Do not submit credentials or secret material to public Wardright resources.

13. Restricted Government and Customer Information

Unless Wardright has expressly authorized a suitable channel and the governing agreement allows it, you may not submit classified information, CUI, source-selection information, procurement-sensitive information, export-controlled technical data, customer secrets, security keys, or other restricted government or customer information through public website forms, ordinary email, or unauthorised systems.

14. Attempts to Evade Enforcement

15. Reporting Security Issues and Abuse

If you identify a vulnerability or suspected abuse involving Wardright infrastructure, contact contact@wardright.com with enough information for us to investigate. Do not publicly expose sensitive details, access data that is not yours, or continue testing beyond what is necessary to demonstrate the issue without authorization.

16. Enforcement

Wardright may investigate suspected violations and may warn, rate-limit, block, suspend, restrict, terminate, preserve relevant records, cooperate with providers or lawful authorities, and pursue legal remedies where appropriate.

DMCA & Copyright Policy

1. Scope

This Policy applies to material accessible through a website, service, or system that Wardright controls and for which Wardright can remove or disable access. It does not give Wardright authority to remove content hosted solely by independent third parties.

2. Good-Faith Copyright Notices

If you believe copyrighted work you own or are authorized to enforce has been infringed through material accessible on a Wardright-controlled service, you may submit a written notice. Before submitting a notice, consider whether the use may be authorized, licensed, in the public domain, or protected by an exception such as fair use.

3. Required Elements of a DMCA Takedown Notice

A copyright notice should include substantially all of the following: (a) a physical or electronic signature of a person authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right allegedly infringed; (b) identification of the copyrighted work, or a representative list if multiple works are covered; (c) identification and location of the allegedly infringing material; (d) information reasonably sufficient to contact the complaining party; (e) a statement of good-faith belief that the disputed use is not authorized; and (f) a statement, under penalty of perjury, that the information is accurate and that the submitting party is authorized to act for the rights holder.

4. Where to Send a Copyright Notice

Submitting a notice to this address does not itself establish that Wardright qualifies for any particular DMCA safe harbor; statutory eligibility depends on the nature of the service and compliance with applicable requirements.

5. Processing of Notices

Upon receipt of a sufficiently complete notice concerning material we control, we may review the notice, request clarification, remove or disable access to identified material, notify the affected party, preserve relevant records, and take other steps appropriate under the DMCA or applicable law.

6. Counter-Notification

If material you provided was removed or disabled as a result of a DMCA notice and you believe the action resulted from mistake or misidentification, you may submit a counter-notification where the DMCA applies. A qualifying counter-notice should include the elements required by 17 U.S.C. § 512(g), including the required jurisdiction and service-of-process consent statements.

7. Restoration Following a Counter-Notice

Where the DMCA applies and a valid counter-notification is received, Wardright may forward it to the original complaining party and may restore material after the statutory waiting period unless we receive notice that the complaining party has filed an action seeking a court order.

8. Repeat Infringers

Where required for an applicable DMCA safe harbor, Wardright may adopt and reasonably implement a policy for terminating, in appropriate circumstances, users or account holders who are repeat copyright infringers.

9. Misrepresentations and Abuse of the Process

Knowingly materially misrepresenting that material is infringing or that material was removed by mistake may expose a submitting party to damages, costs, or attorneys' fees under 17 U.S.C. § 512(f) or other law.

10. Trademark and Other Intellectual-Property Complaints

The DMCA is a copyright statute and does not establish a takedown procedure for every type of intellectual-property dispute. Trademark, trade-secret, right-of-publicity, impersonation, or other rights complaints may be submitted to the legal contact below with enough information for us to evaluate the issue.

11. Designated Agent Compliance Note

A service provider seeking certain DMCA safe-harbor protections under 17 U.S.C. § 512(c) may be required to publicly post designated-agent information and register and maintain that agent with the U.S. Copyright Office. Wardright will publish any additional designated-agent information required if and when such designation is maintained. This Policy does not represent that every Wardright activity is eligible for Section 512 safe harbor.
